## RABBI'S MESSAGE

### *Be the Light – Shine with us December 10<sup>th</sup> and Beyond*

As the daylight time grows shorter in the winter, we come to the Hebrew month of Kislev. The middle of the month, in the lunar calendar, includes a full moon. The end of the month is when the moon is smallest. With Kislev coming in the wintertime, the end of Kislev is truly the darkest time of the year. This is when we celebrate Hanukkah, also called the Festival of Lights. On the Hebrew calendar, it is Kislev 25-Tevet 2, bridging the darkness from the end of one month to the beginning of the next. The Gregorian calendar this year has Hanukkah also at the end of December, with the first night December 18 and the last night December 25. While driving the streets in any neighborhood during this time, you're bound to see plenty of electric lights (honoring our neighbors' holiday) that will help hide the darkness. And you may even see some subtle candlelight in windows, the glow of the Hanukkah menorah.

During the height of the Covid pandemic, many experienced a kind of darkness that comes with isolation. Even now, that many of us are returning to more "normal" activities, there still seems to be a cloud hanging by. It can be hard to break out of those feelings, especially when many things still don't feel quite "normal." Hanukkah is a reminder to bring on the light! Anne Frank, the wise teenager who kept a diary while in hiding during the Holocaust wrote, "***Look at how a single candle can both defy and define the darkness.***" We don't need a lot of light to combat darkness. An internal spark of warmth catches on, as the light within each of us can help illuminate another's heart.

We can take some comfort when looking at the Eternal Light (in Hebrew "Ner Tamid") that shines above our Torah. Even when we are not in a sanctuary, we know that every ark in every synagogue has such a light to remind us that Torah is constant, people are constant, God's presence is constant, and our collective spirits can be constant. Individuals bring with them a unique light, and while shining, can be the spark that helps others.

**Jeff Kaufman** is just one example within our community of such a light. He has devoted so much time and talent to helping Temple Beth Torah and the community. As a younger man, he helped save lives as an EMT, and in the 25 years or so that his family has been in Kingwood, his leadership has helped our community survive and thrive. December, approaching the year's darkest month, is the perfect time to have a ***Ner Tamid*** celebration to honor a shining example of what the term "**Eternal Light**" is all about. Individuals bringing their unique sparks to help others shine. Temple Beth Torah, like a single Hanukkah candle, is a small but powerful light. We illuminate the spirit of Judaism and community in a geography that can embrace our presence. And we can only do that with shining lights like Jeff Kaufman, who use their energy to light that spark, and keep us glowing.

Please join us to honor Jeff and his contributions for the Ner Tamid Award on December 10, and then come back on Friday, December 16, to add your own light to our Hanukkah celebration. And our world will continue to glow.

## Torah Portions for December 2022

*Summarized by Rabbi Dan Gordon*

### **December 2-3, 2022, Vayeitzei, Genesis 28:10-32:3**

Along his journey, Jacob experiences G-d's presence through dreaming of a ladder with angels ascending and descending from heaven. He pledges himself to G-d and continues to his uncle Laban's home. He falls in love with Laban's daughter, Rachel and asks to marry her. He promises to work for Laban for seven years to marry his daughter, but is surprised to find the older sister, Leah, in his wedding bed. Laban informs him it is customary to marry the older child first, so Jacob pledges another seven years of labor to marry Rachel. Leah is more fertile, bearing six sons and a daughter. Rachel pleads to G-d for children, and eventually bears Joseph and Benjamin.

### **December 9-10, 2022, Vayishlach, Genesis 32:4-36:43**

Jacob has left Laban's land after 20 years of service. Along his journey home, he prepares to meet Esau for the first time since their bitter argument. The night before their meeting, Jacob wrestles with a "man," who turns out to be a messenger from G-d. He is injured in the fight, and receives a new name, Israel, meaning, "one who wrestles with G-d." Jacob and Esau reunite, with Jacob humbling himself before his brother. Jacob's only daughter, Dina, is raped by a neighboring prince. Simeon and Levi, in an attempt to avenge their sister's honor, kill all the males. Jacob informs them that their reaction was too severe, bringing dishonor to the family.

### **December 16-17, 2022, Vayeishev, Genesis 37:1-40:23**

Joseph, through Jacob's favoritism and his own boastfulness, has created a jealous situation between him and his brothers. When he comes to check on their work, they toss him into a pit and conspire to kill him. Instead, they sell him to traveling slave traders, and he ends up in Egypt. He rises to become the head servant of Potiphar's household, until Potiphar's wife falsely accuses him of trying to rape her. He is imprisoned and develops a reputation in jail for being able to interpret dreams.

### **December 23-24, 2022, Miketz Genesis 41:1-44:17**

Joseph successfully interprets Pharaoh's dreams and becomes a powerful man in Egypt. The famine in Canaan forces Joseph's brothers to come begging for food, and they don't suspect his identity. Joseph tricks his brothers into coming back again with their youngest brother, Benjamin. Benjamin is found with a stolen (planted) goblet, and the brothers fear that, if anything happens to Benjamin, it would be too much for Jacob to handle.

### **December 30-31, 2022, Va-Yigash Genesis 44:18-47:27**

After a stolen goblet is found in Benjamin's bag, Judah asks that he be held prisoner in his brother's place. Joseph cannot hide his identity anymore and has a tearful reunion with his brothers. He invites the whole family to move to Egypt, where he has achieved power. On the journey to Egypt, God speaks to Jacob in a vision. He solidifies that Jacob will now be known as "Israel," and promises to be with his people in Egypt and to eventually bring them home. The entire tribe migrates to Egypt, where they are permitted to live peacefully.

### BURT LEVY MEMORIAL LIBRARY FUND

This fund maintains the library and helps purchase new books. Our library, located in the back of the sanctuary, is named after TBT's founding president, Burt Levy, who was a major inspiration in starting Temple Beth Torah.
