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RABBI'S MESSAGE

23 Prayers for the New Year, 2023

For those of us born more than 23 years ago, it seems daunting that we are so deep into a new century. 23 is known as a “prime number,” because of its unique characteristic of not being divisible by any other number other than 1. 23 is the ninth prime number, and there are 25 primes in the first 100 numbers of counting. Why is this important? I’m not sure! But as we welcome a New Year as a “prime” year, perhaps we can find unique ways to make it special. With that in mind, I offer 23 prayers, rather than resolutions. Resolutions are individual. Prayers often rely on help from divine as well as human resources. This is my list for the New Year...want to think about yours?

Dear God: *With Your Divine help, and added wisdom from those around me, I pray:*

1. To be able to recognize my strengths and use them wisely;
2. To understand my limitations and work within them;
3. To truly listen to what the world is teaching;

Saturday, February 11


**6:00 PM Potluck Dinner, followed by

Prior to Covid, "The Jewish Night of Why" was one of Temple Beth Torah's most popular annual events. It is simple, fun and engaging! The title of the evening is based on Alfred Kolatch's book series called, *The Jewish Book of Why*, which is a wonderful addition to every Jewish library. Kolatch's books give simple answers to hundreds of questions about Jewish ritual, holidays, practices, and customs with a technical scholarly perspective.

When TBT gathers, we discuss some of these questions, but also focus on many of the philosophical issues that are part of the Jewish world today as well as our own community. It is a personal way for us to learn from each other. Participants pose their questions anonymously, by placing written questions in a "hat." Rabbi Dan's philosophy is that there is often a variety of possible reasons why Jews do what Jews do! He will offer his perspective about what's on your mind, and others will be able to discuss other possibilities. In the classic Jewish way, we will learn from each other!

Prior to the discussion, we will share a "potluck" dinner. Please be mindful of TBT's Kosher Style – not mixing meat and dairy in the same dish and no pork or shellfish products.

Torah Portions for January 2022

Summarized by Rabbi Dan Gordon

January 6-7, 2023, Va-Y'chi, Genesis 47:28-50:26

Jacob, at 147 years old, blesses his grandchildren, Ephraim and Menasseh, blessing the younger before the elder. He makes Joseph promise to have him buried with his forefathers in Canaan. Jacob calls all his sons to him and tells each what he thinks of them. After his death, Jacob's sons take him to Canaan for burial and then returned to Egypt. Joseph dies at 110 years old, after reconciling with his brothers again. The Biblical family is at home in Egypt as Genesis ends.

January 13-14, 2023, Shemot Exodus 1:1-6:1

We begin the Book of Exodus with the sons of Israel (Jacob) and their families settled in Egypt. But a new king arises who does not honor the relationship Joseph had established. Because of Pharaoh's fear of a revolt, male Hebrew babies are ordered to be killed. With the help of conspiring midwives, Shifra and Puah, Moses' mother saves him by putting him in a basket where he is later found by Pharaoh's daughter and adopted. Moses kills an Egyptian taskmaster and flees to Midian. He marries, and while watching his father-in-law's sheep, G-d appears to Moses out of a burning bush that is not consumed. G-d reveals His plan to free the Israelites and sends Moses and his brother Aaron to speak to Pharaoh about freeing the Hebrew slaves.

January 20-21, 2023, Va-eira Exodus 6:2-9:35

G-d reveals His sacred name to Moses and tells him that he is the first one to know it. G-d assures Moses that He will be with him as he negotiates with Pharaoh. The plagues begin: blood, frogs, vermin, locusts, cattle disease, boils and hail; but each time, Pharaoh's heart is hard, and he does not free the Hebrew slaves.

January 27-28, 2023, Bo, Exodus 10:1-13:16

The plagues continue with Pharaoh's lack of response predictable, as G-d reveals to Moses, *"I am hardening Pharaoh's heart in order to increase My wonders - so you will tell your children and grandchildren how I toyed with Egypt, and the wonders I put in them. And they shall know that I am God."* (Exodus 10:1-2) For years, scholars and commentators wonder why ten plagues were necessary. The Torah suggests that the plagues had to be memorable enough for us to continue to retell the story. The Israelites receive instructions to place blood above our doorposts as a sign for the angel of death to "pass over" our homes, and the Torah reveals laws about how to remember Pesach/Passover in the future.

GENERAL FUND

Any donation that is not specified to another specific fund goes to the General Fund, which helps maintain the operating budget of the temple. Building expenses, insurance, staff salaries and all program expenses that are not underwritten come out of the General Fund, as well as support for the Religious School.

RABBI'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

This separate tzedakah fund enables the rabbi to make confidential contributions to help individuals and causes that may be in crisis. The rabbi may also use this fund to help support unbudgeted programs that will benefit the temple or community.

BURT LEVY MEMORIAL LIBRARY FUND

This fund maintains the library and helps purchase new books. Our library, located in the back of the sanctuary, is named after TBT's founding president, Burt Levy, who was a major inspiration in starting Temple Beth Torah.

TRACY TOBIN JOHNSON MEMORIAL EDUCATION FUND

This fund provides scholarships to Jewish summer camps for children and for educational conferences for teachers. It also helps support special educational programs that are not in the general budget. The fund honors Tracy Tobin Johnson, who was an active TBT member, volunteer and teacher before passing away at a young age.
